A Bit About Our School

Our school recently celebrated the advancement of our highest ranking black belts - GJN David Barrett received his 6th degree Black Belt (Yuk Dan). SBN Laurel Zoppi and SBN Jon Cory (from the Pine Lake True Martial Arts) and I received our O Dan ranks - 5th degree Black Belt. As students gave congratulations, they also asked questions about the process, which I can say involves a great deal of both martial arts and personal development. I also realized that many of our students and families were not very familiar with some of the recent history of our style and our school. I would like to give a brief overview of that here.

The style that we teach and learn here at True Martial Arts is American Chang Moo Kwon Tae Kwon Do. It is derived from the Chang Moo Kwon style that was passed down from Sa Bum Nim Chang Hae Choi to SBN Dan Di Vito, to SBN Thomas Zoppi, to GJN David Barrett, and on to all of us. As SBN Zoppi taught and studied, he gradually modified and revised the requirements, keeping the tradition of the art while strengthening the system and keeping it relevant to our students. There came a time when SBN Zoppi determined that our style had diverged from the original Chang Moo Kwon enough that it was truly its own style - American Chang Moo Kwon.

When SBN Thomas Zoppi passed away, he passed the guardianship of the system to David Barrett - then Kyo Bum Nim. He led both True Martial Arts schools (Overlake and Pine Lake) as Chief Instructor for several years, while Laurel Zoppi retained ownership of the schools. In 2007, GJN Barrett purchased the Overlake True Martial Arts, becoming both Owner and Chief Instructor, while the Zoppi family retained ownership of the Pine Lake True Martial Arts and GJN Skyler Zoppi took the role of Chief Instructor there.

A few years later, the leaders of the True Martial Arts schools came together to create the American Chang Moo Kwan Leadership Council. The Council is a committee made up of the highest ranking and longest serving individuals in the American Chang Moo Kwon system. It currently consists of David Barrett, Skyler Zoppi, Leah Zoppi, Jennifer Berg, Laurel Zoppi and Jon Cory.

We realized that in order for our system to grow and to allow our higher ranking students to continue to progress, that we needed to have a path of advancement in place. The American Chang Moo Kwan Leadership Council provides leadership and direction for the stability and growth of American Chang Moo Kwon and our students.

What does the council do? It oversees rank promotions for 4th degree and higher in the ACMK system, organizes annual events including the SBN Thomas Zoppi Championships and other tournaments (like the recent Arnis Tournament), and promotes communication between leaders of the schools affiliated with the American Chang Moo Kwan system (True Martial Arts in Overlake, True Martial Arts in Sammamish, and Northwest School of Martial Arts in Stanwood).

Going forward, we hope to see our schools grow and prosper, and to celebrate many more black belt promotions. Our system will continue to evolve as our black belts learn and use their knowledge and talents to enrich our whole community. We look forward to seeing what the future will bring.
